## **Apply for SJM Sheldon Jackson Museum's Alaska Native Artist Residency Program Starting November 8th**

The Sheldon Jackson Museum's Alaska Native Artist Residency Program first began over thirty-one years ago. Starting November 8, 2017, Alaska Native artists are encouraged to obtain an application online via the [Sheldon Jackson Museum](#) or [Friends of Sheldon Jackson Museum](#) websites and submit by the deadline, Thursday, Jan. 4<sup>th</sup>. Artists interested in having a copy of the application mailed to them, may call (907) 747.8981 or pick one up in person at the museum. Any questions about the application should be directed to (907) 747-8981.

As an artist-in-residence, artists create art in the gallery space at the museum, teach a hands-on class or give a lecture, and give a Residency Recap Talk. Travel and housing is provided for the longer residencies, typically 21 days. Both shorter residencies, often lastly two weeks, and longer residency positions offer an artist stipend. The residency is competitive. More information will be available on the application form and on the websites as the deadline for submission comes closer.

## First Friday: Opening of two solo artist exhibits for November

The Alaska State Museum is opening two solo artist exhibits. *Moving Mountains*, by sculptor Annette Bellamy of Halibut Cove, pays tribute to the things that sustain us and reflects Bellamy's 40 years of commercial fishing in clay, fish skin, and other media. In his exhibit *Lost Language*, Daniel Papke of Skagway creates paintings that focus on an internal search for the deeper meaning of the images, mythology, and visual narratives that captivate his imagination. Bellamy and Papke are two of eight artists selected for the Alaska State Museum 2017-2019 Solo Artist Exhibition Series. The opening reception is sponsored by the Friends of the State Library, Archives, and Museum.
