For June: Author Talk with Daniel Lee

Henry about John Muir in Tlingit country

Thursday, June 28, 5:30-7 pm, APK Lecture Hall

In his new book, *Across the Shaman's River: John Muir, the Tlingit Stronghold, and the Opening of*

the North, Henry explores John Muir's relationship

to Alaska and its people. The book builds from

Muir's unpublished journals and the author's

interviews with 16 Tlingit elders to reveal a

profound intercultural dynamic rarely seen in

American history writing. Henry is an educator,

journalist, and broadcaster who lived in Alaska for 30 years and founded the Alaska Native Oratory Society. His essay, "A Murder of Crows," was the winner of the 2000 Pushcart Prize. This program will be recorded by KTOO-TV for later broadcast and online on our [At the APK](#) show on 360 North.

The Sinking of the Princess Sophia: A Curator Talk with Brittany Vis

Friday, July 6, 6:00-7:00 pm, **APK** Lecture Hall

Join Brittany Vis, Associate Director of the Maritime Museum of British Columbia, to learn more about this summer's *Titanic of the North* exhibit and the disaster behind it. Vis will highlight select stories of individuals on board, explore the immediate aftermath of the tragedy including the recovery efforts and court proceedings, and share images of artifacts and historic photographs that have been donated to the Maritime Museum since the launch of the traveling exhibit in January. Vis has worked at the Maritime Museum since 2015 and is originally from the Fraser Valley in BC. She has a Bachelor's in English literature and Canadian history from the University of Victoria and a Master's of Library and Information Science from the University of Western Ontario.
